



- Tested within the sector






## Learning outcomes for frontline social care staff

- 2. Be able to apply relevant data security and protection legislation and principles
- **3**. Be aware of physical and digital threats to data security and know how to avoid them, including:
  - i. being alert to social engineering
  - ii. safe use of digital devices
  - iii. safe keeping of physical records
- 4. Be able to identify data breaches and incidents and know what to do if one happens

Abdul works at Tree Tops care home. The care home relies on paper-based records as it doesn't have a digital social care record.




Annie is a support worker for Willows Support. She is often out and about in the community visiting the people she supports.

It's not just legal issues we need to think about. It's also a question of trust. People trust you with their data and they need to be confident we won't break that trust. It's the right thing to do so that people can feel secure that their privacy is protected.







## **DSPT training – final thoughts**

The Digital Care Hub website does not allow care providers to make accounts and assign training, giving a lower barrier to entry.

Once the member of staff has completed the training, they can email the certificate to their manager for filling.

If using a shared computer to complete the training, it's recommended that staff fully complete the training before the next person using the training.

At the time of launch there are no plans for the training to be updated yearly, however the national team will review that decision

NHSMail is a fundamental part of becoming a digital care provider – it is a pre-requisite for many things including DSCR and Proxy Access.





- NHSmail isn't worth getting
- Using NHSmail means more annoying tabs open
- NHSmail doesn't help care recipients

- Extra security, 24/7 support, selfservice
- Outlook app can solve this

 By reducing admin times, it can help both staff and recipients

# **Digitisation in Social Care**

### **Digital Social Care Records / DSCR**

We are grant funding up to 50% of the first year of licenses and implementation costs for a DSCR, the funding is currently capped at £4,711.623 per CQC registered ASC provider.

## **Sensor Based Fall Prevention and Detection / SBFPD**

We are grant funding the full cost of buying and setting up sensorbased falls technology for the first year. This funding is capped at £500 per service user.

## What are the benefits of a DSCR ?


### It will save time

Data entry times for DSCR are going down from 45 minutes per care recipient per day to 18 minutes per care recipiente per day.

### It will help you get to know the individual

# DSCR Funding Criteria

- You will transfer from paper to an electronic assured supplier. This can be back dated to April 2022.
- You must agree to be an active and consistent partner; provide regular updates on progress of purchasing and use of DSCR to the DISC Programme Team using tools provided.
- You must provide evidence of benefits of use of DSCR in your business up to March 2025. We have tried to make this as easy as possible for you, sending you a short questionnaire once per quarter.
- You must provide a digital champion in your business who will support colleagues in using the DSCR effectively.
- You must be CQC registered.
- You must have NHS Mail. We can help with this.
- You must be DSPT registered (<u>Registration</u> (dsptoolkit.nhs.uk). We can help with this.

# **Sensor Based Falls**



### **Acoustic Monitoring technologies**

- Using acoustic sensors to monitor sounds in the room and alert to calls for help.
- Using AI and infa-red technologies to recognise routines of individuals and then alert to anomalies in this behaviour.
- There are no cameras and no wearables.

# What are the benefits of falls sensors?

- Monitoring individuals between scheduled care visits



Saving time due to less frequent checks



Anomalies in behaviour are caught quickly e.g increased bathroom visits, coughing etc



Responding to falls faster



Improved quality of sleep for care recipients



Peace of mind for carers and families



Improved auditing trail after incidents



All incidents and falls are captured even minor "hidden" falls

SBFPD Funding Criteria • You must be **CQC registered**, use **NHS Mail** and the **Digital Security Protection Toolkit.** (We have teams to help you adopt and apply for these)


• You must be **using a digital care record system**. (We have funding to help you purchase a DSCR, please talk to us)

• You must choose a supplier that uses **acoustic monitoring**, we have a list of suggested suppliers which meet the criteria for funding.

• You must agree to provide **regular updates** on progress of purchasing and use of Falls Technology to DISC Programme Team.

• You must provide **evidence of benefits** of use of Falls Technology in your business up to March 2025. This is once per quarter.

• You must provide **a digital champion** in your business who will support your colleagues in using the Falls technology effectively.
