We are excited to announce our keynote speaker will be Neil Eastwood, author of 'Saving Social Care'.

About Neil Eastwood

Neil began his connection with social care in 1977 as a somewhat reluctant paid home help to ageing parishioners from his father's church. After several adventures, he became director of a homecare provider with 10,000 staff and became fascinated with how to find and keep a high-quality care workforce.

This led to presenting his findings at over 500 care sector events and in 2017, publishing a book, 'Saving Social Care', about his findings, now in its second edition with over 10,000 copies sold.

He is also Founder and CEO of Care Friends, an employee referral app, which won the 2023 King's Award for Innovation and is now used in 3,000 care settings in the UK, Ireland, and Australia.

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The day will include presentations, workshops as well as a Q&A panel including health and social care colleagues and MPs. During breaks and lunch, you will have the opportunity to browse numerous exhibitors and network with other delegates from Somerset's care sector.

Put your investigative prowess to the test and join us for an exhilarating twist on the classic escape room experience. Dive into the captivating narrative as you work to clear the name of your colleague. Along the way, you'll uncover top-notch cyber security tips to safeguard yourself and your organisation from the ever-looming threat of cybercrime. Can you crack the code and emerge as the ultimate cyber champion?
